Entries will be received from 8:30 a.m. until 10:45 a.m. Judging will be from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Please do not disturb the judge at this time.

The show and tea is from 1:30 p.m. to 3:00 p.m.

## SECTION A: Annuals

- Class 1: Marigold, 1 large bloom with foliage
- Class 2: Marigold, 3 small blooms with foliage
- Class 3: Nasturtiums, any variety, 3 blooms
- Class 4: Pansy/Viola, 5 blooms shown with foliage
- Class 5: Petunia, Single, any colour, 3 blooms, no foliage
- Class 6: Petunia, Double, any colour, 3 blooms, no foliage
- Class 7: Geranium, 1 stem with bloom and attached foliage
- Class 8: Annual Vine, any variety, 3 stems with foliage
- Class 9: Snapdragon, large, 1 stem, no foliage
- Class 10: Snapdragon, small, 3 stems, no foliage
- Class 11: Zinnia, any variety, 3 blooms, no foliage
- Class 12: Dahlia, Decorative
- Class 13: Dahlia, Ball
- Class 14: Dahlia, Cactus
- Class 15: Dahlia, Single
- Class 16: Dahlia, any other Dahlia (e.g. – Pom Pom; Mignon)
- Class 17: Any other annual, branch, stem or spray

## SECTION B: Perennials

- Class 1: Perennial Phlox, 1 stem with foliage
- Class 2: Daylily, 1 single flower in a container, no stem
- Class 3: Daylily, 1 double flower in a container, no stem
- Class 4: Oriental lily, 1 stem
- Class 5: Rudbeckia, 2 stems with foliage
- Class 6: Echinacea, 1 stem with foliage
- Class 7: Delphinium, 1 stem, no foliage
- Class 8: Perennial Vine, 1 stem with bloom(s) and attached foliage
- Class 9: Clematis, 1 bloom, no foliage, in vase
- Class 10: Hydrangea, Annabelle (large mop heads)
- Class 11: Hydrangea, Grandiflora (cone shaped)
- Class 12: Hydrangea, Oakleaf (inflorescence in open panicles)
- Class 13: Hydrangea, Lace Cap

- Class 14: Hydrangea, Climbing (large flat lace cap corymbs)  
Class 15: Any perennial or biennial not listed above

**SECTION C: Containers**

- Class 1: Planter for sun  
Class 2: Planter for shade

**SECTION D: Houseplants**

- Class 1: Cacti  
Class 2: Succulent  
Class 3: African Violet  
Class 4: A collection of 3 Cacti and/or succulents in a pot or on a tray  
Class 5: Any other houseplant

**SECTION E: Roses**

- Class 1: Hybrid Tea Rose, 1 bloom with own foliage  
Class 2: Floribunda/Polyantha/Shrub Rose, 1 spray  
Class 3: Grandiflora, maximum of 3 blooms with foliage  
Class 4: Climbing Rose, 1 spray  
Class 5: Miniature Rose, 1 bloom or spray with own foliage  
Class 6: One bloom chosen for strength of fragrance with own foliage  
Class 7: Rose in a bowl, 1 bloom without foliage, floating in water, not touching sides of bowl

**SECTION F: Collections**

- Class 1: Collection of Garden Foliage, 5 stems, 5 varieties  
Class 2: Collection of Herbs, 5 stems, 5 varieties  
Class 3: Collection of Roses, 3 varieties, 3 stems with foliage  
Class 4: Collection of Annuals, 3 varieties, 3 stems with foliage  
Class 5: Collection of Daylilies, 3 varieties, 3 stems with foliage  
Class 6: Collection of Perennials, 3 varieties, 3 stems with foliage  
Class 7: Collection of Large Hosta leaves, 3 stems, 1 or 3 varieties  
Class 8: Collection of Small Hosta leaves, 3 stems, 1 or 3 varieties  
Class 9: Collection of Miniature Hosta leaves, 3 stems, 1 or 3 varieties  
Class 10: Collection of Coleus leaves, 3 varieties  
Class 11: Collection of Ornamental Grasses, 3 stems, 3 varieties  
Class 12: Collection of Echinacea, 3 stems, 3 varieties

**SECTION G: Design – “Around The World”**

**Purchased materials and accessories are allowed.**

- Class 1: “Northern Dwellers”, a design using cool colours  
Class 2: “African Safari”, a design using hot colours  
Class 3: “The Desert”, a design to include sand, cacti and/or succulents  
Class 4: “The Rain Forest”, a design predominantly in green

**SECTION H: Fruits and Vegetables**

- Class 1: Any fruit grown by the exhibitor, 3 specimens on a plate
- Class 2: Rhubarb, 3 stems, trim leaf to 1"
- Class 3: Green beans, 3 on a plate
- Class 4: Yellow beans, 3 on a plate
- Class 5: Onions, 3 specimens, roots trimmed to ½ inch
- Class 6: Summer Squash, 1 specimen if large, 3 if small
- Class 7: Tomatoes, red, 3 specimens on a plate, any variety, calyx on
- Class 8: Tomatoes, any other colour, 3 specimens on a plate, any variety, calyx on
- Class 9: Cherry tomatoes, 5 on a plate, calyx on
- Class 10: Potatoes, 3 on a plate
- Class 11: Cucumber, 1 mature specimen
- Class 12: Any other vegetable not mentioned above, 1 specimen if large, 3 if small
- Class 13: Miscellaneous, e.g. oddly shaped or smallest vegetable

**SECTION I: Preserves – Fruits and vegetables used in preserves do not have to be grown by the exhibitor but must be prepared by the exhibitor. Entries will be judged by the following criteria: flavor, uniqueness and overall appearance. All judges' decisions are final.**

- Class 1: Any jam
- Class 2: Any marmalade
- Class 3: Any jelly
- Class 4: Any relish
- Class 5: Any chili sauce or chutney
- Class 6: Any preserved fruit or vegetable

**\*SECTION J: Photography – Participants may enter one photograph in each class. It must contain a horticultural topic.**

- Class 1: "Warm Colours in the Garden"
- Class 2: "Cool Colours in the Garden"
