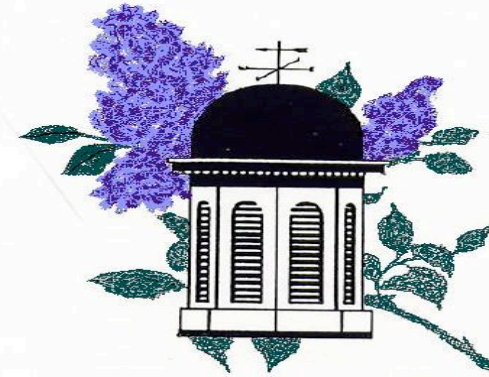

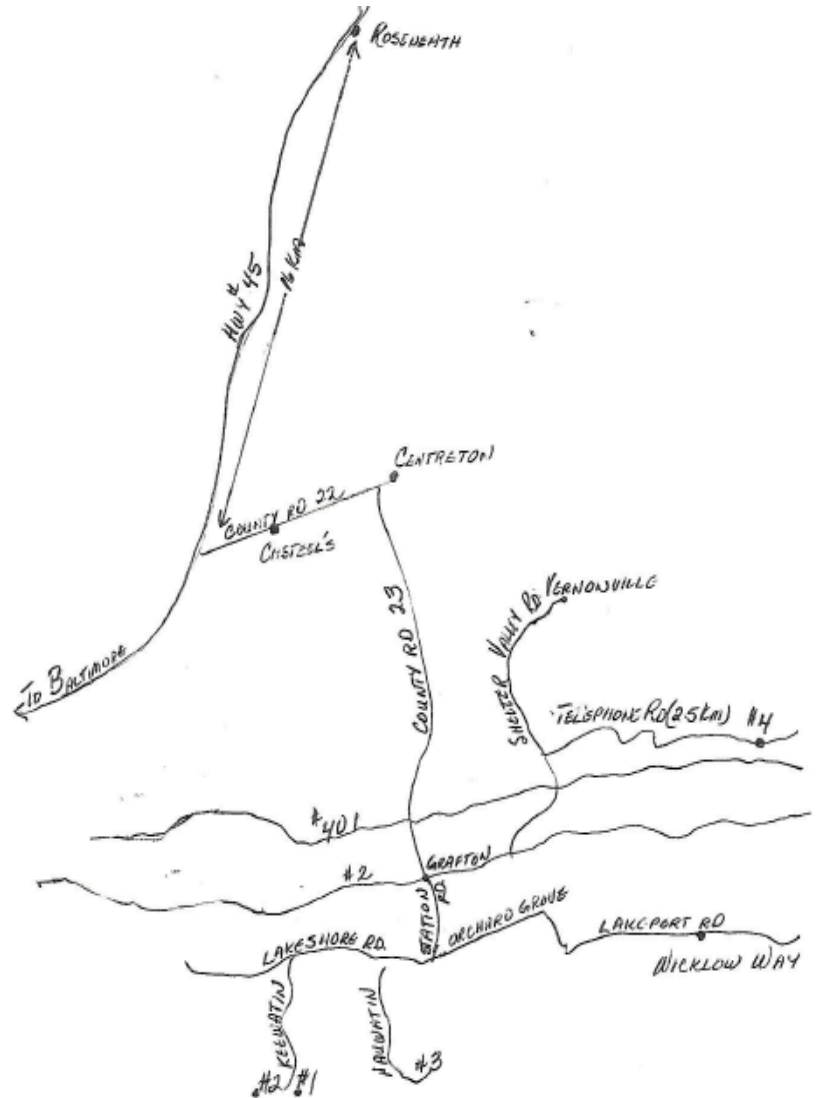
The Annual Four-Club Garden Tour
