*Exhibitors may enter up to 3 different cultivars in most classes, except those marked with an asterisk. Please name the cultivars if possible.

SECTION A: ANNUALS

Class 1 Marigold, 1 large bloom with foliage

Class 2 Marigold, 3 small blooms with foliage

Class 3 Nasturtiums, any variety 3 blooms

Class 4 Pansy/Viola, 5 blooms shown with foliage

Class 5 Petunia, single any colour 3 blooms no foliage

Class 6 Petunia Double any colour 3 blooms no foliage

Class 7 Geranium 1 stem with bloom and attached foliage

Class 8 Annual Vine, any variety 3 stems with foliage

Class 9 Snapdragon, large 1 stem no foliage

Class 10 Snapdragon, small 3 stems no foliage

Class 11 Zinnia, any variety 3 bloom no foliage

Class 12 Any other annual species not listed with above. May be branched.

SECTION B: PERENNIALS

Class 1 Perennial phlox, 1 stem with foliage

Class 2 Daylily, 1 scape single flower

Class 3 Daylily, 1 scape double flower

Class 4 Oriental lily, 1 scape

- Class 5 Rudbeckia, 2 stems with foliage
- Class 6 Echinacea, 1 stem with foliage
- Class 7 Delphinium, 1 stem no foliage
- Class 8 Perennial Vine, 1 stem with bloom(s) and attached foliage
- Class 9 Clematis, 1 bloom without foliage floating in water in a bowl.
- Class 10 Any perennial or biennial not listed above.

SECTION C: CONTAINERS

- Class 1 Geranium, may include other plants in the container
- Class 2 Patio planter not to exceed 20 inches in diameter
- Class 3 Herb grown in a pot.

SECTION D: ROSES

- Class 1 Hybrid Tea Rose, 1 bloom with own foliage
- Class 2 Floribunda/Polyantha/Shrub rose, 1 spray
- Class 3 Grandiflora, maximum of 3 blooms with foliage
- Class 4 Climbing rose, 1 spray
- Class 5 Miniature rose, 1 bloom or spray with own foliage
- Class 6 One bloom chosen for fragrance with own foliage
- Class 7 Rose in a bowl, 1 bloom without foliage, floating in a clear bowl in water

SECTION E: COLLECTIONS

- Class 1 Collection of Garden Foliage, 5 stems 5 varieties
- Class 2 Collection of Herbs, 5 stems 5 varieties
- Class 3 Collection of Roses, 3 varieties 3 stems with foliage
- Class 4 Collection of Annuals, 5 varieties 5 stems with foliage
- Class 5 Collection of Daylilies, 3 varieties 3 stems with foliage
- Class 6 Collection of Perennials, 5 varieties 5 stems with foliage

Class 7 Collection of Large Hosta leaves, 3 stems 1 or more varieties

Class 8 Collection of Small Hosta leaves, 5 stems 1 or more varieties

Class 9 Collection of Coleus Leaves, 3 varieties

Class 10 Collection of Ornamental Grasses, 3 varieties 3 stems

Class 11 Collection of Wildflowers, 5 varieties

SECTION F: DESIGNS/ARRANGEMENTS

This year's theme is "WEATHER RELATED" (It's Canada, eh)

Class 1 "Storm in a Teacup" An arrangement with water

Class 2 "Sunshine on my Shoulder" A mass design using mostly warm/hot colours

Class 3 "Candle in the Wind" A design/arrangement showing movement

Class 4 "Jump into the Fog" A design/arrangement using predominately grays, blacks and whites.

Class 5 "Lightning Strikes" A tall design/arrangement (maximum height 20 inches)

Class 6 "Praying for Rain" A design/arrangement using a combination of wild and cultivated flowers .

Class 7 "Baby, the Rain must Fall" A design/arrangement using mostly green

Class 8 "Weather or Not" Any design following one of the forms for floral design

SECTION G: FRUITS AND VEGETABLES

Class 1 Any fruit grown by the exhibitor, 3 specimens on a plate

Class 2 Green beans, 3 on a plate

Class 3 Yellow beans, 3 on a plate

Class 4 Onions, 3 specimens, roots trimmed to 1/2 inch

Class 5 Summer squash, 1 specimen if large 3 if small

Class 6 Tomatoes, red, 3 specimens on a plate any variety calyx on

Class 7 Tomatoes, any other colour, 3 specimens on a plate any variety calyx on

Class 8 Cherry tomatoes, 5 on a plate calyx on

Class 9 Potatoes, 3 on a plate

Class 10 Cucumbers 1 mature specimen

Class 11 Any other vegetable not mentioned above, 1 specimen if large, 3 specimens if small

Class 12 An oddly shaped vegetable

Class 13 An overly large vegetable

Class 14 Smallest vegetable

SECTION H: PRESERVES

Fruits and vegetables used in preserves do not have to be grown by the exhibitor but must have been prepared by the exhibitor.

Entries will be judged by the following criteria: flavour, uniqueness and overall appearance All judges decisions are final

Class 1 Any jam or marmalade

Class 2 Any jelly

Class 3 Any relish or chutney

Class 4 Any preserved fruit or vegetable
